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





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
#### **Guest Lecture on Critical Theories**


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# Personality Development Programme


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#### GUEST LECTURE ON LITERATURE AND PSYCHOLOGY

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




# GUEST LECTURE PROGRAMME - 18 NOVEMBER 2021



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


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### STUEDNTS' INDUCTION PROGRAMME - 14 SEPTEMBER 2021
