The hiatus between what the individual aspires for and the harsh reality of what he achieves, what he professes and what he realizes and what he would be like to be taken for, has crumpled his life leaving an insidious effect on his inner being. The injuries inflicted and the scares left on his psyche makes him realize his helplessness. Joshi, in all his novels, has tried to explore "that mysterious under world which is the human soul" (The Strange 7).


Billy Biswas the protagonist of the novel is a young, rich and a well educated person. He has everything in his life still he possess some unusual obsessions which make him to get lost in the problems of identity. He belongs to a rich and respectable family. He is the son of Judge of Supreme Court of India. Billy is permitted only to pursue Engineering in America but he started to pursue Anthropology without the knowledge of his father and he is already half way through his Ph.D in Anthropology.

When the novel starts Romi, the witness-narrator goes back in the past and recalls the strange case of his friend Billy Biswas. He decides to narrate the story of Billy not because he has understood him, because as he grows mature, he realizes that "the most futile cry of man is his impossible wish to be understood. The attempt to understand is probably even more futile" (The Strange 7).

Arun Joshi has clearly brought out the odd feeling of Billy and has shown his protagonist Billy as a man whose is completely fed up with the materialistic society. He is lost in his problems of identity. Though he has his own family, he has some sort of loneliness. His outward journey is symbolic of his quest for self-realization.

The first part of novel reveals the quest for identity of Billy's soul in the midst of the upper class Indian society. Character of Billy is understood from the narration of the narrator. Most of the people who meet him considered him as a light-hearted good sport, but his eyes reveal his deep sombre look. Tuula Lindgren, the Swedish girl, doing an advance course in psychiatric social work and Romi are the two people who understand the dilemma of Billy's life.
